#### 1. Application form

- 2. Write a letter of 1-2 pages in which you briefly address the following:
  - Your career goals, both short and long range,
  - Your background and areas in Sociology that you would like to know more about, and
  - Identify one or more Sociology faculty who are familiar with your academic performance.
- 3. A copy of your transcript (unofficial accepted) and other related information about your academic progress -- such as course equivalency confirmation from other institutions.

#### SOCIOLOGY HONORS PROGRAM

The Honors Program is open to outstanding Sociology majors during their Junior and Senior year. To gain admission to the program, potential Honor students normally take Sociology courses in 120 "Sociological Theory," 110 "Research Methods," 10 A-B-C "Probability and Statistics," and at least two Sociology core courses. Students who receive an average grade of 3.5 or better in these five courses (including one of the three A-B-C statistics courses) will be eligible for the honors program. In addition, Honor students should have an average of 3.2 or better in all courses taken at UC Irvine. Majors who are transfer students may petition for entry into the program based on their grades from their former schools.

During their junior/senior year, Honor students will write a thesis, designed and carried out under faculty supervision. Projects will normally entail some empirical analysis of sociological data. Students will meet regularly in a two-quarter Honors Seminar (Sociology H188A and H188B) to design and carry out these projects, to exchange ideas, and to help analyze each other's work. In addition, Honor students will be required to attend between six and nine Sociology guest lectures (students must attend at least three lectures in Winter Quarter and the remaining lectures in Spring Quarter) and subsequent meetings to discuss relevant sociological issues. Upon successful completion of the program, students will graduate <u>"With Honors in Sociology"</u>.
